I know most cameras these days have zoom lenses but some recent photo outings for me and my Mamiya 7 roll film cameras has reminded me how useful it is to go out with just 1 lens and look for pictures that suit the lens. On a recent trip to Amsterdam I was taking the tops of buildings with a 150mm lens and last weekend I was out in the local Peak District hills with just a 65mm lens (divide these numbers by 2 for the equivalent full-frame dslr lens). Sorry no images to demonstrate yet as I haven't processed all the films. I will put them on the web site eventually though. I seldom use either of these lenses but it gave me some good images. It may get you out of a rut and producing something a bit different! Try it and see.

A really wide-angle lens also has to be used carefully to avoid making the background appear too small in the final image. These are great for allowing pin-sharp foreground interest as well as keeping everything really sharp through the rest of the shot. This is my most used type of lens, for me that means 43mm (divide by 2 again for comparison) but I also use the standard lens quite a bit.
